Gender Audit: 2019-2022 Observations

- Female student enrolment is more than that of males, with better academic outcomes and high university toppers among girls.
- Satisfactory participation of female students in Cultural Activities, NSS, and NCC.
- Adequate facilities for health, hygiene, safety (CCTV, security), canteen, and parking for female students and staff.
- Dedicated support systems include a Counselling Center for Girls and a functional Vishakha Committee.
- Programs like Vidyarthini Manch and 'Amhi Jujau Savitrichya Leki' promote female empowerment through health, hygiene, and career awareness.
- Equal gender ratio among teaching staff; however, fewer female nonteaching staff noted.
